Manipur peace panel formed

Assam CM visits state for troubleshooting

THE Centre on Saturday announced a committee for the violence-hit Manipur that will facilitate the peace process among various ethnic groups and initiate dialogue between conflicting parties.

The state remained incidentfree on Saturday but given the prevailing tense situation, the government extended the ban on internet till June 15.

The Ministry of Home Affairs said the peace committee would be headed by Governor Anusuiya Uikey. Its members include Chief Minister N Biren Singh, some ministers, MLAs, leaders from political parties, former civil servants, educationists, litterateurs, artists, social workers and representatives of different ethnic groups. The committee has been also assigned to strengthen social cohesiveness, mutual understanding and facilitate cordial communication among various ethnic groups.

The BJP's go-to man and troubleshooter in the Northeast, Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma, visited Manipur on Saturday and met his counterpart, cabinet ministers, party leaders and civil society organisations.

"For us, peace and stability in Manipur are very important. I will report whatever discussions I had during the day to the Union home minister (Amit


"The NCP chief tried strike a balance between the two factions in the party by giving them equal opportunity," a political observer said.

Less than 50% of rail passengers have insurance cover

THE deadly Odisha train tragedy that claimed 288 lives and left over 920 injured has brought to the fore a serious issue of train journeys not covered by insurance unless opted for in online booking of tickets.

Railway sources said most passengers travelling in trains or the parcels transported by them are not insured. Insurance is only available for passengers booking their tickets online. That, too, is optional.

While Indian Railways Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC) offers passengers insurance coverage up to ₹10 lakh at a premium of 35 paise, no insurance component is involved in tickets purchased or booked at railway counters. Passengers who book tickets at railway counters and those travelling in general coaches do not have any



insurance cover:
Over two crore people travel in trains in the country daily and if insurance coverage of passengers is any indication, at least 50% do not

have any Only a little over 50% of passengers getting tickets online opt for travel insurance, sources said.

In the context of Odisha train tragedy, the railway has announced ex gratia of ₹10 lakh in case of death, ₹2 lakh for grievous injuries and ₹50,000 for minor injuries while state governments concerned have also declared ex gratia and compensation packages up to ₹5 lakh for the next of kin of the victims.

Those who had booked tickets through IRCTC would get additional ₹10 lakh for death, ₹10 lakh for permanent disability, ₹7.5 lakh for partial disability, ₹2 lakh for hospital expenses on injuries and ₹10,000 for transportation of mortal remains. Most of the crash victims will not get the benefits as they were travelling in general coaches, which bore the brunt.

Min faces public wrath over bad road, newly-formed JAC threatens protest

JOINT Action Committees (JACs) are not new to the State. From opposing separate statehood to drawing attention to issues concerning employees and farmers, several JACs have been formed to take up agitations and to meet the demands of respective groups. However, in a first-of-its-kind, a JAC has been formed demanding repair of a 29km-long road in Aluru, Kurnool district. What's even more appalling is Aluru happens to be the seat of state labour minister Gummanur

The stretch, which connects Adoni to Holagunda, is riddled with crater-sized potholes. Though it goes through at least 10 villages, the giant potholes cover the full width of the stretch for as long as the eye can see in Naganathihalli, Lingampalle, Vandavagili villages. The road has been in a dilapidated condition for the past two

The Holagunda mandal, which connects almost 60 per cent of the rural villages, is situated on the Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka border.

The government aims to provide opportunities for the youth to work in the public sector. Following a court order, the recruitment process for government jobs in Chhattisgarh has rapidly gained momentum. Various departments are continuously issuing advertisements for new recruitment, and where the selection process is completed, appointment orders are being issued. After a long wait, the selected sub-engineers of the Water Resources Department, as well as the newly appointed junior engineers and data entry operators in the Energy Department, are feeling enthusiastic upon receiving their appointment orders. The Chief Minister congratulated all the selected engineers and data entry operators. He said that your and your family's dream of joining government service has been fulfilled. Now all of us together have to fulfill the dreams of the people of Chhattisgarh. You have a big responsibility. Throwing light on the energy scenario of the state, the Chief Minister said that the demand for electricity has increased from 4100 MW to 5300 MW in the last four and a half years. Consumption of electricity is increasing in agriculture, industry

and domestic sector. In such a situation, it is the responsibility of the newly selected junior engineers of the Energy Department to maintain a continuous supply of quality electricity, to expand the power infrastructure with quality. The Chief Minister said that such a large number of engineers have been recruited in the Water Resources Department after a long time. Along with providing water to the fields, the engineers of the Water Resources Department have to take care of the supply of water to the industries and the drinking water system, for this there are great hopes from you. Chhattisgarh State Power Companies had conducted the examination in January 2022 for the recruitment of 307 posts of Junior Engineers and 400 posts of Data Entry Operators. 

CHHATTISGARH HIGHER EDUCATION DEPARTMENT BAGS SKOCH SILVER AWARD FOR "PROJECT ASSESSMENT AND ACCREDITATION"

he Department of Higher Education, Chhattisgarh has been awarded the prestigious SKOCH Silver Award for "Project Assessment and Accreditation." The department received this award after competing with several significant and noteworthy projects in the country through various stages of presentations, voting, and achievements. Chief Minister Shri Bhupesh Baghel congratulated the department officials and employees for their outstanding achievements. To improve the quality of higher education, a campaign has been launched on a mission mode to ensure an academic substructure and maintain academic standards in accordance with various parameters set by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). Chhattisgarh has secured the top position in the country by getting 197 out of 211 eligible government colleges accredited by NAAC. The State Government's continuous efforts have yielded positive results, with an increasing number of students enrolling in colleges. In 2018-19, approximately 2,26,373 students took admission in colleges, whereas, in 2022-23, this number increased by 48 per cent to 3,35,139. This represents an increase of 1,08,766 more students compared to 2018-19. In response to the increasing number of college students, a total of 33 new government and 76 private colleges have been established in the past four years. In a bid to promote higher education among girls, 26 women's colleges are being operated, while coeducation is available in other colleges. During the academic year 2018-19, the number of girls who took admission in colleges was 1,34,391, while boys were only 91,982. However, in 2022-23, the number of male students increased to 1,28,310, while the number of female students increased to 2,06,829, indicating a 61 per cent increase in the number of female students to that of male students.

Brainchild of Vizag researchers, 'Taramandal' to design and develop indigenous satellites

N idea struck during Covid-19 pandemic has reached a tangible shape owing to sustained efforts in space research and technology by a group

of Vizag youth led by their mentor and Head of the Department of electrical department of Andhra University. Their dream to make low-cost satellites will be realised soon as their model is nearing completion and its prototype will be ready in another six months.

The youths from different branches of engineering stream, who are alumni of Andhra University, joined forces to form the first start-up 'Taramandal' in space technology in the State, incubated at A-Hub Incubation Centre in Andhra University. Naming their low cost satellite model as 'Tarasat', the team is now developing a sub-system for the satellite, 'Taracon'.

The startup has been cofounded by Vineel Judson, D Rajesh, M Gautam, T Neelakantasewarareddy and N Rama

Severe heatwave in 50 mandals

Visakhapatnam registers record temperature of 43.4 degrees Celsius on June 10, says IMD

ANDHRA Pradesh was engulfed by an intense heatwave on Saturday as temperature soared above 40° Celsius in many areas across the State. The relentless heatwave, accompanied by scorching hot air, has had a severe impact on various regions, making it highly inconvenient for the public to both stay indoors and commute.

The highest maximum temperature of 45.6° Celsius was recorded at Udayagiri in Prakasam district and Palasa in Srikakulam. Akkivaram in Vizianagaram closely followed with 44.8° Celsius, while Padmanabhan in Visakhapatnam and Juvvigunta in Prakasam reached 44.7° Celsius. Anakapalle recorded a temperature of 44.3° Celsius. Furthermore, severe heatwave conditions were observed in 60 mandals, and heatwave conditions prevailed in 116 mandals. Of them, 21 mandals were in Anakapalle district, two in East Godavari,

seven in Kakinada, five in Prakasam, three in Srikakulam, one in Nellore, eight in Visakhapatnam, and 13 in Vizianagaram.

Visakhapatnam encountered its most severe heatwave of the year, witnessing temperature exceeding 42° Celsius in multiple areas across the district. The region was subjected to blistering hot winds and extraordinarily high levels of precipitation, culminating in an extremely intense heatwave

scenario. The normally bustling Beach Road and other streets presented a deserted and desolate sight as extreme weather conditions and scorching hot winds prevailed in the

According to the Andhra Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (APSDMA), a severe heatwave is forecast in 50 mandals, while a heatwave is predicted in 219 mandals on

Among these, one mandal is

in ASR, 18 in East Godavari, 18 in Kakinada, nine in Konasee-ma, and four in West Godavari.

The India Meteorological Department at Amaravati has reported that the maximum temperature is expected to be 2-4° Celsius above normal, and the prevailing heatwave conditions are likely to continue for the next two days. Also, thunderstorms with accompanying lightning are likely to occur in isolated places.


With the announcements of the two rebel YSRC MLAs shifting their loyalties to the opposition TDP, the political scenario

Unfortunately, there is no alternative route to travel to other villages and towns without passing through Holagunda. This, in fact, has hit nearly 1,900 students studying at Holagunda Zilla Parishad High School, who are completely dependant on the bus services.

In order to address the problem, nearly 45 different associations, student unions, political parties etc, have united to form a JAC irrespective of their political affiliations. All of them have been crying foul over one demand-good road.

But he is not willing to settle for this position and said that he would continue in the party as an ordinary leader and as an MLA,

"If IRCTC can offer death coverage of ₹10 lakh for train travellers, why cannot the Railways make insurance cover mandatory for all passengers? They can seek a premium like IRCTC does and insure the travellers like the corporation does through insurance companies,' suggested Pravakar Jena, manager of a life insurance company.

Railway officials said insurance was inbuilt in all train tickets over a decade ago. But, it was stopped after insurance companies backed out citing huge losses due high incidence of train accidents in those

Indian Railways, however, pays a compensation of ₹8 lakh as awarded by Railway Claims Tribunal (RCT) for death of passengers and as decided on the basis of loss of earning capacity. This means all kin of 288 deceased and 920 injured can apply for claim from RCT but it would be long-drawn process due to the documentation involved. "For that, the kin of the deceased family has to provide all supporting documents. Similarly, the parcels are insured with the condition that the consignor opts for payment of percentage charge on excess value declared and paid subject to a maximum of 1%," he added.

ongress Legislature Party leader Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka who has been on a padayatra --People's March -- with the slogan 'KCR Mukt Telangana', crossed the 1,000km milestone on Saturday in Nalgonda district. Excerpts from the interview

How is your padayatra going on? How is the response from the people?

The separate Telangana movement was built on employment, water, irrigation, and the distribution of wealth among the people. Your padayatra's slogan is 'KCR Mukt Telangana'. Would you be able to do that? KCR has become the stumbling

block for achieving the aims and aspirations of the people like irrigation, employment, self-respect, wealth **Express** creation and distribution, and land distribution. We had thought that if a separate state became a reality, they would automatically become available. But it has not happened. Who is responsible for this? It is KCR. He and his family are in the way of the development of the

How is KCR blocking development?

Water was the main objective of the Telangana movement. Particularly, Krishna and Godavari river water. We had hoped to tap the water and provide it to the parched fields in Telangana. Now it is almost a decade since Telangana state was created. What did KCR do in respect of Krishna River water? The projects conceived on the river are still pending like the SLBC tunnel. 90% of the work was completed, but in the 10 years, KCR could not get time or resources to complete the remaining 10% of the work and provided water to Nalgonda district.

The same is the case with Palamuru Rangareddy LIS. In the decade gone by, Telangana could not access even a single drop of water from the Krishna River. Regarding Kaleshwaram, KCR claims it is the biggest project in Asia. I have been to the project sites at Medigadda, Annaram, and Sundilla. They are not barrages in the strict sense of

the term. They just check dams, maybe a little bigger. There are no canals for these barrages.

Do you think your slogan — KCR Mukt Telangana — will have any traction with the people?

KCR has created that perception. But it is not because of him that Telangana has become a reality. It was because Congress decided to divide the state. KCR has been winning elections, promising the moon to the people. In the last nine years, he has damaged the economic fabric of the state.

He has looted its resources, its land. Today, people have realised that they had fought for Telangana to better their lives and not to be looted by someone else.

WITH the kin of Odisha train tragedy victims still waiting for identification of 81 bodies and the government planning for mass cremation, the locals of Bahanaga are organising a mass mundan (tonsuring) programme and 10th day rituals to pay tribute to the departed souls. The three-day programme will begin on Sunday, the

10th day after the tragic crash, and end on Tuesday with the culmination of a mammoth Gayatri Yajna for peace, prosperity and purification. Elaborate preparations are on at Bahanaga high school

grounds. The school premises had become a temporary morgue after the mishap.

The locals, who had turned the first responders to the disaster and engaged wholeheartedly in rescue and relief operations, said they felt the tragedy was their own. More than 200 people, young and old, have come forward for 'mundan' (shaving heads) that is practiced as one of the most important Hindu rituals in case of death of a near and dear one.

The mundan ritual will begin from 10 am and continue till all are tonsured. A mass prayer has been organised in the evening. Monday onwards, an Astaprahar Nama Yaina (24 hour Hare Krushna chanting) will be organised along with Biswa Shanti Maha Yajna (havan for world

"A Sarva Dharma Prarthana Sabha (mass prayer of different religions) and chanting of veda from 10 am onwards have been planned. We hope the programme will help bring comfort to the affected families and the community," said Jayakrushna Sarangi, a member of the organising committee. Members of Gayatri families from four districts have already arrived for 'mantra japa' which will be held at a shed near the accident spot.

Karnataka govt may hike liquor prices to mop up funds for five guarantees

Bengaluru: The Congress government is likely to increase liquor prices to mop up additional resources to fulfill its five poll guarantees in the state. According to sources, the Finance Department is working out modalities for revision of Additional Excise Duty (AED) on liquor in the budget to be presented by Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on July 7. It is, however, unclear whether the tax burden will be passed on to all 18 slabs of Indian Made Liquor (IML). The slabs are categorised by Maximum Retail Price (MRP) in ascending order, and range from around ₹56 to ₹1,200 per pint (180ml).



TOXIC MASH: AIR, WATER, FOOD AND **CLIMATE CHANGE**

HE New York Skyline this week emerged as an unwitting exhibit of the global reality of climate change and the haze over inaction. Smoke from wildfires in Canada, covering over 10 million acres, billowed and belched toxic air enveloping the city in a shroud of smog. The city found itself on the list of the world's worst in air quality. As New Yorkers struggled to cope with an unusual condition, a time-lapse video shared by the National Weather Service on Twitter went viral across time zones triggering schadenfreude among those for whom poor air quality is an inescapable circumstance.

Toxic air is a reality visible and palpable across the globe. A 2022 report from the World Health Organisation shows that across 6000 cities in 117 countries monitoring air quality, "the air in 17 per cent of the cities in high income countries falls below WHO Air Quality Guidelines." The state of poorer

countries is worse. In low and middle-income countries, air quality in less than 1 per cent of the cities complies with WHO thresholds – a fact millions in India and elsewhere in the developing world will testify to. It is manifest in the loss of over 6.5 million lives every year worldwide.

The etymology of the phrase smog is of comparatively recent vintage. It was coined in 1905 by H.A. Des Voeux, a health official, to define 'atmospheric conditions' in British towns. Ostensibly pollution then was a local phenomenon. The phrase climate change or climatic

change came into usage only after the 1970s. Globally around 4 million sq km of vegetation burns every year -- in Australia, Amazon, Canada, Russia and the United States -- which emit gases that worsen air quality across national borders and global warming.

The callous exploitation of natural resources underlines the context that has created a mash-up of toxins - in the air we breathe, the water we drink and the food we ingest. Consider the state of water. Data published by UN Water show that over 2 billion people, or roughly a quarter of the world population, lack "safely managed" drinking water and 2.3 billion live in water-stressed countries.

Groundwater accounts for a major share of human consumption and is threatened by contamination by fertilisers, pesticides, industrial and mining wastes, petroleum products and solid waste landfills. A Lancet report reveals that water pollution was responsible for 1.4 million premature deaths in 2019. The World Bank has observed that shallow groundwater in every populated region should be considered at risk of pollution.

A useful metric to understand the impact of 'consume and dispose culture' is the magnitude of toxic trash generated by the rampant use of plastics. Of the 7 billion tons of plastic waste generated globally so far, less than 10 per cent has been recycled. The UNEP estimates that the world produces around 400 million tonnes of plastics per year. Roughly around 10 million tonnes end up in the ocean, accounting for 80 per cent of all marine pollution. It is well established that microplastics enter the food chain and accumulate in the food we eat, such as fish and shellfish. And it is not just seafood that is impacted by air and water pollution. A 2019 study, based on commonly consumed food items by US residents, estimates that an average person consumes between 74,000 and 121,000 microplastic particles.

There is no disputing that pollution, politics and policies are exacerbating global warming. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, in its 2023 Synthesis Report, reveals that "Widespread and rapid changes in the atmosphere ocean cryosphere and biosphere have occurred. Every increment of global warming will intensify multiple and concurrent hazards." Human-caused climate change is increasing the incidence and frequency of extreme events such as droughts, heavy rainfalls and heatwaves.

Earlier this year, analysis by NASA showed that "Earth's average surface temperature in 2022 effectively tied with 2015 as the fifth warmest on record". Rising temperatures are throwing up new challenges. A study by Mark C. Prosser, Paul D. Williams, Graeme J. Marlton and R. Giles Harrison states that Clear Air Turbulence "is projected to intensify in response to future climate change". This has ominous portents for aircraft safety and millions of travellers. And the projections for global temperature are only worsening. The World Meteorological Organisation has observed, "There is a 98% likelihood that at least one of the next five years, and the fiveyear period as a whole, will be the warmest on record."

The planet is confronted with a confluence of consequences, an exponential rise in pollution, accelerated loss of biodiversity and intensified climate change. It is useful to remember that since 1905, when the phrase smog entered the lexicon, the world population has grown from 1.6 billion to 8 billion and the world GDP from US \$ 3.4 trillion to over US \$ 105 trillion. The pressure of population and the need for resources is showing up on planet Earth. The clichéd truth is that there is no Planet B! The visuals of the New York skyline are yet another reminder for introspection and action.

HE spirit of royalty is loyalty—honoured or betrayed. In the erstwhile princely state of Rajasthan, whose history is marked by intrigue, war and riveting romance, an electoral ambush happening in the deceptive dunes of democracy is a possibility. Instead of the chivalry that fueled the feudal warrior code of yore, caste flies the flag of power now. As the state gears up for polls, the battle lines are drawn not by ideology but by political liege lords donning the crowns of caste and region. But the nature of court gossip has not changed, and speculations spice up election masala. More than the delivery record of the Ashok Gehlot government, drawing room chatter and street corner scuttlebutt concerns whether Sachin Pilot will finally be the new Congress CM face and will BJP position Vasundhara Raje as the challenger to Gehlot or a younger

However, in both camps, caste prevails over merit. Both national parties have been holding secret parleys and public sit downs to revive their respective organisations and boost government machinery. The Congress leads the news space. Former Deputy CM, the 45 year old Pilot, has been on the road to drum up support for himself first and his party later. His objective is to connect with grassroots workers and convert the Gehlot government's infirmity in taking action against corruption in the previous Raje administration. But his real target is Gehlot. Sachin's explanation to his party and his promoters is that he is merely asking the High Command to honour its earlier commitment of declaring him the CM candidate before the elections. But they aren't in an obliging mood. The big enchiladas feel that since age is on Sachin's side, he can wait a bit more. They haven't forgiven him for his aborted attempt to topple the state government by walking out with 19-odd MLAs, a move considered to be prompted by the BJP. But caste is the real cause behind the Congress flip flop. Gehlot has already broken a record by staying in power for three full terms: in 1998, 2008 and 2018. He became chief minister in 1998 when he was just 47—the

first CM from a backward caste (malis) to break upper caste domination in Rajasthan politics. The BJP government he trounced was then controlled by the powerful Thakur leader Bhairon Singh Shekhawat. Pilot's play is to capture power on the dual basis of caste and merit. He has both

a degree and a pedigree. The son of former Union minister Rajesh Pilot, Sachin studied abroad. The Congress made him not just India's youngest Central minister but also state party president. But unlike his father, who was a national player, Sachin chose the state arena plagued by caste and community contradictions. Rajesh was aware of his limitations and eventually abjured state politics to become a leader with prime ministerial possibilities. But Sachin deviated from his father's playbook and chose Rajasthan as both his karma-bhumi and ran-bhumi. Under his leadership as state president, the Congress won around 100 seats in 2018 which put him in line to become

the youngest CM of Rajasthan. But Gehlot won the race and a by-election thanks to his wider acceptability among decision makers. Many Congress leaders feel that Sachin is better qualified for a major national role than wasting his talent by confining himself to a state. They speculate that his rapport with the younger Gandhis could turbo his rise faster, and the time is ripe for geriatric leaders who occupy the CWC posts to be put to grass. However, while the Gandhis are convinced that Sachin's youth and clean image are assets, his liability is his caste—the Gujjar community, which doesn't have even a double digit share in the state population. Sachin's cardinal mistake was to identify himself

with them when he went to jail over seeking ST status for Gujjars. Historically there is no love lost between Gujjars, Jats and Thakurs. Thakurs have gained at the cost of Gujjars while the Jats are still fighting to grab power.

It is no coincidence that Rajasthan has never

had a Gujjar or Jat as CM. Of the 28 interim or formal chief ministers sworn in since Independence, 24 were from the Congress. The BJP had just two. Interestingly, the first interim Chief Minister was a Brahmin. Subsequently, the Congress appointed three Brahmin CMs—Jai Narayan Vyas, Tika Ram Paliwal, Hari Dev Joshi whose rule, put together, lasted less than a decade. Significantly Nehru and Indira chose leaders from the insignificant Bania community to run the state in order to pacify feuding upper castes. Mohan Lal Sukhadia, a Jain, was CM for over 17 years, encompassing four terms. Experimenting with other castes like Dalits, Kayasth, and Muslims didn't work for long. In 2018, Gehlot, being Backward, was placed on the throne again. The BJP was restricted to the Thakurs or royalty. Only the canny Vasundhara, who shifted from her maternal state Madhya Pradesh to Rajasthan, could acquire the image of a sarva samaj leader because of her family relationship with both Gujjars and Jats. The Congress has played safe by

striking a caste balance, not allowing any dominant caste to dictate terms. Its hesitancy to install Sachin as CM stems from the reality that Gujjars have too many enemies among other communities. The party feels that Gehlot has mobilised all backward sections behind him and marginalised the Thakurs using welfare schemes and public outreach. Targeted welfare schemes have given him the image of Rahat Baba (Relief Baba). The High Command perceives Gehlot as a stabiliser and unifier who can win the ballot again. However, it is also obvious that he could be replaced with a younger leader like Sachin; but only after the election has been won. The decision to retain Gehlot also stems from the fact that the BJP will deploy anti-incumbency rhetoric and promote Modi-backed caste leaders as alternatives. With Queen Bee Raje sidelined and sulking, the popular perception about CM aspirants like Bhupender Yadav (Ahir), Ashwini Vaishnaw (both Brahmin and a Marwari), Gajendra Singh Shekhawat (Thakur) and Om Birla (Bania) is as representatives of their own castes; not leaders with the mojo and merit to lead the state. All of them have been attending massive conclaves organised by their communities. Rajasthan is undergoing a social transformation wherein upper caste and elite caucuses are out of the reckoning. The ironic level playing field is Backwards vs Backwards. Both Gehlot and Sachin are part of the new social chess game of India. Who is the pawn or the king will be decided by the caste satraps of a royal land where shatranj was a game of royals, by royals for royals.

OH, FOR THE LOVE OF GOD!

ATHER paradoxically, now seems both like the best and worst times to make films on Hindu mythology. On the one hand, the renewed interest in telling the tales of our land means that there's a ready audience for such stories (as seen in the

popularity of myth fiction as well) and social media goodwill to boot, provided the makers play their cards right. And yet, filmmakers have to walk a tightrope in this new world that places impossible, often irrational, expectations on art and artists.

The makers of Adipurush (an upcoming Hindi-Telugu adaptation of Ramayana) might have accepted the criticism of the VFX in its original trailer to be warranted and as being fair game. When they addressed some of the issues and released a new trailer with a background score punctuated by high-pitched choral screams of 'Jai Shri Ram', they might have been forgiven for thinking that only effusive love would pour forth from then on. In a recent twist befitting social media, though, actor Kriti Sanon—who plays

Sita in the film—was judged as an inappropriate fit for the character for having played 'glamorous' roles in the past. Most well-meaning responses questioned the double standards by sharing some old film clips in which Prabhas (playing Rama in Adipurush) plays characters who don't necessarily act in gentlemanly ways. Thankfully, these responses didn't result in Prabhas being denounced for playing Ram.

Can you imagine if self-anointed defenders of purity also unleashed their irrational wrath on male actors? Akshay Kumar, who plays God in the upcoming sequel, OMG 2, would be an easy target, given some of his roles in the past. What if these guardians of morality and art went back in time to criticise other actors who have played God? Amitabh Bachchan played God 15 years ago in God Tussi Great Ho; Sanjay Dutt played Lord Yama in Vah! Life Ho Toh Aisi!—and that's a bad god to get on the wrong side of. The examples across Indian cinema are far too many. Yet, this burden of purity, perhaps in keeping with the functioning of Indian society in general, is placed on only women actors.

Strangely, or perhaps not so strangely, this indictment of heroines who play deities has some precedence. Many years ago, Nayanthara, who played Sita in the Telugu film, Sri Rama Rajyam (2011), was also deemed an inappropriate casting choice for reasons that had nothing to do with cinema and everything to do with her personal choices. This film, incidentally, went on to do incredibly well, receiving, it would appear, the kind of blessings some believers didn't think were possible. The same actor played a goddess in Mookuthi Amman three years ago, and a stray voice or two on social media raised some opposition, which wasn't attractively incendiary enough to garner any momentum

Thank God for that. When questions are raised about the character of heroines who play gods, perhaps the best response, even if wellintended, isn't to ask why similar exacting standards don't apply to heroes. This ends up almost as validation of the original criticism. The best straight forward response would be to demand

the separation of art from the private, unproblematic choices of the artist. So powerful is the pressure of 'good behaviour' on those working on devotional films that the cast and crew often advertise choices not necessarily connected to the making of the film. Heroines working on deity films have often spoken proudly about abstaining from non-vegetarian food during the shooting. We have had filmmakers talk about entire sets eating 'pure' food and thinking' pure thoughts' while making such films. A good thought experiment would be to consider the ridiculousness of those playing evil roles—say Saif Ali Khan playing Raavana—trying to emulate behaviour befitting their character in their life. Somehow, we can spot the ludicrousness and isolate a performance for public consumption from the performer's private life.

Better questions can be asked when making such adaptations, not aimed at protecting God but at creating a better society for us humans. One east tion would be, why are beautiful women from our myths always portrayed in our films as being fair to a fault? While there may be room for debate over Sita's descriptions, what about our depictions of Draupadi, clearly described as a dark-complexioned, beautiful woman? Another useful question could concern the rudimentary notions of good and bad such adaptations proffer—especially when these go on to fuel real biases. While Tamil films like Raavan and Kaala have turned the conventional white-vs-black, good-vs-evil narrative of Ramayana on its head to great value, why does the larger, national interpretation still feel rather monochromatic? What must the objective of such adaptations be anyway? Should it be to inspire propaganda and fuel singleminded devotion... or should it be to foster a greater understanding and tolerance for humanity in general? So long as simple questions are asked and simple problems raised, our cinema shall continue giving us simple answers.

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Opacity in OROP calculation angers veterans

Anomaly at many levels alleged after 2022 revision on the basis of average minimum and maximum pension in '18

LACK of transparency and bureaucratic apathy in calculation of One Rank One Pension (OROP) has embittered the retired junior commissioned officers and personnel of other ranks. JOYEETA GUPTA HOPE RIDES ON

THIS INDIA-ORIGIN SPINOZA AWARDEE

N June 7, 2023, five days short of her 59th birthday on June 12, the Dutch Research Council (DRC), as if like an advance birthday gift, announced the name of Indiaorigin Joyeeta Gupta as a recipient of the prestigious Spinoza Prize, also called the 'Dutch Nobel Prize'. She is a Professor of Environment and Development in the Global South at the Amsterdam Institute for Social Science Research, University of Amsterdam, and IHE Delft Institute for Water Education in Delft. She is also co-chair of the Earth Commission founded by Future Earth and supported by the Global Challenges Foundation.

The Spinoza Prize, among the highest academic awards in the Netherlands, is bestowed annually on four researchers. Gupta is chosen for the prize for her outstanding, pioneering, and inspiring scientific work in which she focuses on a just and sustainable world.

The Delhi-born Gupta has a varied academic background: schooling in Loreto Convent School in Delhi Cantonment and the Air Force Central School at Subroto Park; economics at Del-

hi's Lady Shri Ram College; a law degree from Sir LA Shah Law Col-

lege in Ahmedabad; and Mas-ter's in Law at the Harvard University, USA, on the Inlaks fellowship in 1988. It had nothing to do with climate change.

Her first brush with climate change came in 1989. She was on her second job in Amsterdam, at the Ministry of Environment to help with developing climate policy. "(But) I knew nothing of climate change. It was Pier Vellinga, head of the climate group there who initiated me into the ins and outs of climate change. When he left the ministry to lead an Environmental Institute at the Vrije Universiteit, he invited me to join the university on a PhD project, and since then I have been working on climate

change issues. The same year, by sheer coincidence, the IHE Institute for Water Education was looking for someone to teach water law. "I was the only candidate, and so water became the second area of expertise that I have been working on. It has been an interesting journey - hard work was central, but I met a lot of key people along the way who helped shape my career," Gupta says, also crediting her husband Johannes van der Hoeven and son Zubin van der Hoeven for

Profession of soldiers greatest of all,

She plans to use the prize money to work on implementing her ideas on sharing the eco-space (environmental utilisation space) globally - an idea which would require a global environment constitution, aiming at protecting environmental conditions in an equitable manner worldwide using constitutional law to bring global environmental and developmental issues together.

The idea is this: Land and fresh water is limited, but can be shared with each other and with nature. Strategic minerals and metals are available in declining quantities. Phosphorus, essential for agriculture, for instance, is limited and gets dissipated through improper use in our land and water. The disposal of greenhouse gas emissions into the

atmosphere is causing the problem of climate change and local air

pollution. If nature is not looked at, problems are bound to occur.

Gupta gives an example: if pollinators die, as they are currently, who will pollinate

our farms and gardens? "Thus there are limits to our resources and sinks (the capacity of the Earth to deal with our wastes). This leads to challenges: first, such damage to nature and the bio-geophysical domains leads to damage to human health and wellbeing; and second, it means we have to find new ways to share the limited eco space. If we leave this eco space to the market, only the rich can afford these resources.

Therefore, the concept of eco space helps to understand local-to-global justice issues linked to taking on responsibilities to live within limits, being accountable for the harm caused to others; and once these limits are recognized, to share the space with each other. Gupta's latest research project, in May 2023, was 'Earth System Boundaries', scientifically quantifying safety and stability of people and the planet, respectively. Her future work on eco space could be a game-changer, bringing hope for our planet vis-a-vis climate change and its impacts.

AMID the row over the 22nd Law Commission's recent recommendations to retain sedition laws and enhance punishment, a public consultation held by the 21st Law Commission seems to have revealed that more than 90 per cent of public opinion was in favour of repealing the colonial-era legislation.

However, this consultation paper or its suggestions are not available on the current Law Commission's website.

A member of the 21st Law Commission told this newspaper that the panel had published a consultation paper in 2018 and sought public views on the amendments to IPC Section 124A from stakeholders, scholars, academicians, intellectuals, the government and

civil society members. The term of the 21st Law Commission, headed by retired iudge B S Chauhan, ended on August 31, 2018.

"The consultation paper on sedition laws was prepared after a painstaking effort for more than a year. There were public consultations and seminars on these laws. We held deliberations with people from all walks of life. We went to the public and tried to get the views of people. Public opinion was

In its consultation paper, the 21st Law panel said that irresponsible exercise of the right to free speech and expression cannot be termed seditious, and called for rethinking on the laws. It maintained that for merely expressing a thought that does not align with the policy of the government of the day, a person should not be

charged under the law. While the previous papers are not found on the website, the latest report of the law panel said that it has, "in its first meeting held on 17th January 2023, discussed the issue of usage of the law of sedition and was of the considered view that it requires a detailed examination, keeping in mind the various developments in the recent past ... Looking into the urgency of the matter, the commission has discussed this issue with various stakeholders and scholars and made detailed research on the subject matter,

finalising this report," it said. The 22nd Law Commission proposals, which were released recently, invited stringent criticism from many quarters including Opposition parties for allegedly making the laws more draconian to suppress dissent. In May last year, the Supreme Court put a hold on the operations of the sedition law.

Vegetarian diet better for kidney patients, says study

RESTRICTING protein intake among adult chronic kidney disease (CKD) patients, irrespective of having diabetes or not, may not work for Indians, according to the latest study, which also claimed that a vegetarian diet is more effective than animal protein.

Most guidelines for CKD management recommend protein restriction, which the study, published in Science Direct, said is controversial.

The study aimed at reaching a "consensus on the topic, especially among Indian adults."

Before recommending guideline-directed protein restriction, assessing the nutritional status of people with CKD is essential, particularly in countries like India, where the average daily protein intake is poor, said the study's findings.

'The prescribed diet, including the quantity and quality of proteins, should be tailored to the person's habits, tastes, and needs," said the study.

The study concluded that low protein consumption across all sectors, regions and income



groups in India must be factored in before routinely recommending a low-protein diet to all Indian adults with CKD.

"There is a close relationship between dietary protein intake and its effect on renal function. Evidence suggests that high protein intake causes deterioration of renal function in people with CKD," the report added. In India the prevalence of CKD is very high, around 13 % to 17 %. Commonest cause of developing CKD is hyperten-

sion and diabetes. The study also concluded that a vegetarian diet could be

CKD. "This is particularly relevant for India, where almost half the population prefers a vegetarian diet or a predominantly a plant-based diet with very little animal protein," said the study.

The study acknowledges a close relationship between di-

etary protein intake and its effect in renal function. "Evidence suggests that high protein intake causes deterioration of renal function in people with CKD.

Dr Upal Sengupta, Nephrologist, Fortis, Kolkata, and one of the authors of the study, said, "Protein restriction has been in vogue with variable amounts of evidence that protein restriction in some way is going to help prevent the progression of chronic kidney disease.'

A low-protein diet in adults with stages 3-5 CKD who are not on haemodialysis reduces the severity of uremic symptoms, thereby delaying the initiation of dialysis, he added.

Uremic symptoms happen due to kidney failure, nausea, loss of appetite, and lethargy.

"In our scenario, we see a large number of poor patients who don't get a good amount of protein. Further restriction in protein will make them malnourished and worsen their condition if we start dialysis," Sengupta said.

However, he cautioned that they certainly should not take Keto diet.



"Priyanka Gandhi Vadra will be in MP soon, I want the Congress to apologize for Singhar's statements and Kamal Nath should take strict action against his former cabinet colleague,' said Bajpai. Singhar isn't the first Congress MLA in pollbound MP to claim that Lord Hanuman was a tribal.

AMU student develops mobile ECG device

Sami Saud, a student of computer engineering at Aligarh Muslim University, took a year-anda-half to work on a mobile ECG device which will reflect the condition of heart on laptops or mobile phones display, making it easy for the patient to see and reach out to the cardiologist swiftly. Those suspected to have heart issues can carry it around with them.

It will help address issues like sudden cardiac arrest leading to demise of the person within no time, as such cases have gone considerably up after the pandemic.

The finger-sized ECG device has been developed by Saud, a second year student of M.Tech, after going through a complex research process under the guidance of Prof Sarosh Umar and Dr Muneeb Khan of the computer engineering department of AMU

According to Saud, he initially worked on a hardware for

four months but failed to get the required results. He started working on another hardware again and finall, he was able to make a break through. "

Sharing the mode of operation, Saud said that as the finger-sized device is placed at a point on the chest near the heart, it starts measuring the heart beats just like the ECG.

"The device would then be connected either to the laptop or mobile phone through blue tooth and generate pictures the pulse on the display.

The device has a built-in machinery algorithm which can detect the abnormality in heart functioning and the report of it could be sent across to the cardiologist concerned through WhatsApp.

After removing the initial glitches and errors, the device was designed afresh. It was tested on the patients with cardiac issues. The device was put to test on cardiology patients of AMU Medical college and general public as well, said Saud. The device gave encouraging results, matching findings of ECG machines installed in hospital. The device was tested for a period of eight months.

On what is the way forward Saud says that for now, there was some refinement left to be done in the hardware to make it match the industry level. "After completing those modalities, we will go for its patenting by next month. Then we will collaborate with some tech company for its market production," says Saud.

Saud said that the initial cost incurred in making the device stood out to be around ₹12,000, which was a bit inflated but the market value would be around ₹4,000-₹5,000."

India's semiconductor dream: A work in progress

Experts pin hope on country's prospect of becoming semiconductor hub, critics raise doubts

INDIA'S dream of becoming a semiconductor hub is work in progress, with a long-winding road ahead of it.

It certainly didn't make best of start. Vedanta-Foxconn, which announced the ₹1.5 lakh crore semiconductor plant in Gujarat last year, was stymied by the government. It didn't approve Vedanta-Foxconn's application to set up the semiconductor fab (fabrication unit). Instead it asked the joint venture to reapply for the same.

Critics have raised doubts about India's ambitious plans to become a semiconductor hub as the country has not made any significant progress in the industry, even after over a year-and-a-half since an-

nouncing the PLI scheme. Why making semiconductor

is important for India This is certainly worrying for the country, considering that the Indian semiconductor market is projected to reach \$80.3 billion by 2028 at a CAGR of 17%. In simple terms, if the country fails to develop its semiconductor ecosystem, it will have to rely solely on imports, which will increase its import bill. Furthermore, it will make it difficult to achieve its target of a \$300 billion electronics manufacturing ecosystem with \$120 billion in exports by 2026.

Seizing the opportunity

India started considering seriously the development of a semiconductor ecosystem only after Covid-19, when the entire industry was disrupted and production of electronic items worldwide came to a halt due to the lockdown. Termed as the most vital part for any electronic item, the shortage of semiconductors created massive problems for the electronic manufacturing industries. This made the world rethink its dependency on a single country, Taiwan, which manufactures 90% of the chips used worldwide, for such a vital item.

India saw it as an opportunity to develop its semiconductor ecosystem, and in December 2021, it announced a ₹76,000 crore Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme to invite major players to start semiconductor manufacturing in the country. However, it is easier said than done, as nothing concrete has been done on the ground other than the announcements and tie-ups.

Tiding over teething troubles

Can India tide over the teething problems, and create a semiconductors manufacturing ecosystem? Experts and the government maintain it can. The government is confident

it will make India a semiconductor nation. Rajeev Chandrasekhar. Minister of State for Electronics and Information Technology, said India is becoming a semiconductor nation, which is not a small task. "It is a complex area. But in many areas of semiconductors, we are making progress," said the minister. He said the entire GPS system will be

powered by an Indiandesigned Navic chip, developed in partnership with government and private sector startups. "In packaging, soon there will be some proposals that are critical to the technology space,"he added.

Gupta of VLSI Society of Ir dia said after the announcement of the semiconductor mission, a 45-day window was given to submit applications. For the global companies this is a relatively short period, they need at least six months to make a decision. "The announcement of opening the window for applications till the end of 2024 is much-needed and a welcome move," said Gupta.

THE government on Saturday modified the semiconductor manufacturing schemes. Now, the approval for setting up of compound semiconductors and display fabs assembly and test units will be issued by the Union Cabinet on June 10, 2023. The Cabinet will be the sole authority to grant approval for applications under the PLI scheme.

Earlier, the approval for applications involving a value up to ₹100 crore used to be issued by the Ministry of Electronics and IT (MeITY) and those above ₹100 crore were evaluated by the Union Minister for

"Applications shall be appraised and evaluated individually on an ongoing basis. The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology will place the applications for approval of the Union Cabinet,'

setting up Semiconductor Fabs and Display Fabs, starting June 1, 2023. Companies can apply for the scheme till December 2024. "Now, proper marketing for the mission is being done globally and companies have sufficient time to prepare to submit their applications, many global firms like Micron Technology for memory packaging are showing interest," added Gupta.

INDIAN OVERSEAS EARNINGS POUR IN, BUT THERE IS A RED FLAG

NDIANS working abroad account for the highest remittances to their home country. Mexico is a distant second. The Reserve Bank (RBI) is likely to release the balance of payments data for FY2023 by the end of June, and it is widely expected that that remittances made by Indian workers will not only cross the \$100 billion mark, but could even touch \$110 billion. The projection to breach the \$100 bn mark is based on World Bank's November 2022 'Migration and Development Brief' which says for the first 9 months of the calendar year, Indians had repatriated \$81.6 billion.

The World Bank report also showed Indian income earners withstood global headwinds far better than the rest of the developing world. Compared to the 5% growth of worker remittances to low and middle income countries for the first 9 months of 2022, remittances by Indians working abroad shot

These remittances have played a crucial 'balancing' role for the economy. They have been a bulwark against the oil shocks of 1973, 1979 and 1990-91 by cushioning foreign exchange reserves, and ensuring a debt servicing record free of default. During the pandemic, when exports sank to the bottom, they covered the growing deficit. Workers' remittances are the largest constituent of current receipts after merchandise exports; and finance more than 15% of current payments since

The World Bank rightly notes that these remittances are vital tomaintaining and improving the quality of life back home. "They alleviate poverty, improve nutritional outcomes, and are associated with increased birth weight and higher school enrollment rates for children in disadvantaged households.

Why the stampede?

There's flip side to this story. If there are so many Indians moving abroad, and sending their earnings home, there must be some unhappiness and hurt; or is it unfulfilled aspiraculean effort to cut one's umachievement of these expatriates, or should we be concerned? There's something going wrong. At the bottom of the pyramid, young men in small district towns without jobs are moving to the Gulf as carpenters and plumbers. Those with higher tech skills find their placements are not good enough, and long-term career prospects are better abroad.

Global Wealth Migration Review data showed that around 7,000 Indian millionaires moved abroad permanently in 2020. They perhaps found doing business was easier abroad. MOEF data also shows nearly 9 lakh Indians have given up their citizenship over the last 7 years since 2015. Many of these fear political persecution.

HORTLY before tea on Saturday, the mood turned. As if a batch of rain-bearing clouds had replaced blue-bird skies without any warning. In pursuit of history, India were motoring

along. The crowd, a majority of them wearing blue, had settled in with their post-lunch beer mugs and accompaniments. On the field, the Australians were already forced into one ball change; the effect of leaking five boundaries inside the first four overs. They did have 444 runs to play with but Rohit Sharma and Shubman Gill had very quickly set the tempo. So, Pat Cummins removed himself and gave the replacement ball to Mitchell Starc.

Off Starc's second delivery, Sharma helped the short ball behind square for a six. That was the mood the two openers were in. Forget about playing for tea. While Gill stood his ground — as he was entitled to — the third umpire took his time, pouring over the finer details of the catch from all angles available to him (with no soft signal to guide him, he was free to make his own decision, his own interpretation). While replays were inconclusive to say the least, the umpire was of the opinion that Green's fingers

were underneath the ball. As soon as 'Out' flashed on

WTC a test before big summer for Australia

FOR India, the World Test Championship final is a chance to bookend a fairly successful two-year campaign. After the assignment against Australia, they get a month's rest before the Tour of West Indies, their first trip of the next WTC cycle.

For Australia, the WTC final comes at a curious time. At some level, it's almost the undercard for their main event of the Summer, an away Ashes. Sure, Pat Cummins, who has been the Test skipper for the majority of this WTC cycle, will like to get his hands on the ICC title but the subtext for the majority of the last 10 days has been hard to miss.

Till Friday night, four Australians (Steve Smith twice, Travis Head, Pat Cummins and Mitchell Starc) have had press conferences. Almost every question they have been asked links back to the Ashes in some way, shape or form.

If it's not about countering Bazball, it's about deciding between picking Scott Boland or Josh Hazlewood, the ChatGPT answer to the pacer ideally suited to exploit English conditions. A day before the match, Cummins was asked about how he was viewing the final considering a few people — perhaps tongue-in-cheek were referring to this as a 'warm-up' for the Ashes. To be fair to Cummins, he did say 'this (the final) was an event in itself'.

Starc, who has had an up and down Test so far, had to remind the Australian cricket press corps that the final was still up in the air after Friday's third day. "There will be plenty of discussions after this game (when asked about his plans for the Ashes)," he said. "First and foremost, we need to win a Test Championship and then we will focus on the England side with the next five Tests." To another question on the venues he prefers in England, he once again had to speak about the Test at The Oval. "Based on the last time, not many," he smiled. "We will wait and see. but we have got two days of cricket here to focus on first. We will get onto the Ashes after that.'

Smith also sang from the same hymn sheet when he was asked on the subject. "We are all just looking forward to this week," he said. "As I said before, it's two years in the making, I suppose, of getting to the final of the World Test Championships. So, you know, it's a big week for us and India. So we'll get through this and then we'll focus after that.

Saying that, an away Ashes series win is perhaps right at the very top in the wishlist for cricketers from both nations. More so because of the challenging nature of winning a series away from home these days. Australia, for instance, haven't won in England since the 2001 series. That wasn't lost on Cummins. "After this Test, we kind of start again... doesn't get much bigger than an Ashes away series. There will be a winner after this game and you kind of move on and start afresh."The skipper, who hasn't played much cricket coming into the final, was also asked on the lengths he may want to bowl and the potential of playing all five Ashes Tests a day before the WTC final. "I think the way it's set up (the schedule of the five Tests) is pretty good," he said. "You play two Tests, week off, two Tests, week off. So, yeah (plan to play all five Tests)." Having already won both white-ball World Cups, several members of this group will love to get their hands on the mace. But irrespective of whether they do it or not on Sunday, focus, as they have said, will move to the first Ashes Test at Edgbaston beginning June 16.
